## **Bodies in Motion**

This session focuses on research that advances understanding of how things move, from the smallest particle to the largest galaxy, and all the bodies in between, including, but not limited to, research from fields of physics, astronomy, engineering, and kinesiology.

## Sustainability

This session is targeted at research that will guide us through an uncertain future, bridging the knowledge from, but not limited to, research on climate change, the environment, food and water, energy and business.

## **Healthy Societies**

This session is targeted towards research areas that deal with understanding and improving the human experience, including, but not limited to, research from the colleges of Engineering, Social Science, Communication, Arts and Literature, Music, Nursing, and Medicine

#### Science in Society

This session focuses on how science, either social or natural, impact society in multiple ways including, but not limited to, research done from the colleges of Social Science, Engineering, Natural Science, Law, Medicine, and Arts and Literature.

The Three Minute Thesis Competition (3MT) is returning this year with a "People's Choice" category again. The first-place winner will be sponsored to attend the regional competition in Wisconsin, in April. The top three winners in each category — oral, poster, 3MT— will each be awarded prizes of \$300, \$200, and \$100 respectively.
