ORIENTATION

- COGS Eboard and representatives attended 24 department & college-wide orientations/orientation resource fairs over 18 days in late August-September
- Distributed over **2000 informational materials**
- Distributed brochures and COGS items to various departments as requested for recruitment events and spring semester orientations.
- COGS President served on GradX panel to discuss how graduate students can make the most out of student support resources

UNIVERSITY CONNECTIONS

- COGS President asked and was allowed to speak at the Graduate Program
 Advisory Committee meeting in July 2019. This group consists of graduate
 secretaries & program directors from among all the college departments. She
 intends to attend future meetings in the hope of getting more visibility for
 COGS among graduate secretaries who have direct access to their graduate
 students.
- COGS President and VPEA attended meetings with the MSU Executive Mgt Director Government Relations to see how COGS might navigate advocating for Graduate students on a more federal level.
- COGS President has initiated meetings with new Student Wellness dept.
- COGS President is meeting with Culinary services to discuss starting a program of cooking demos focusing on healthy eating - for graduate students to participate
- COGS leadership has served on University-wide search committees/transition teams to provide the graduate/professional student perspective on important University hires, including:
 - MSU Presidential Transition Team
 - MSU nationwide search for Provost
 - COGS has participated in searches for Title IX AVP
 - Executive Director of Career Services
 - Director of Women Student Services
 - Executive Director and Assistant Provost of Admissions and Enrollment Strategy
- COGS leadership consulted with Alumni Relations with aims to fundraise for COGS Professional Development fund endowment and plans to continue those efforts going forward.



- COGS leadership has worked to recruit/nominate graduate/professional student representation on two new, high-level University posts: Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Planning Steering Committee and Strategic Planning Steering Committee (SPSC)
- COGS leadership has worked to recruit/nominate graduate/professional student representation on Hearing boards, including AUSB, USAB, SFSB and UPGJ and UJG, as well as representation on over 25 committees across the University that affect a full range of the student experience, from issues of diversity, to research, curriculum, campus issues, mental health, insurance, curriculum, transportation, community relations and more.

ADVOCACY

- In 2019-2020, COGS Full Council passed 47 pieces of legislation, which can be viewed on the COGS website (new section added this year!): https://cogs.msu.edu/governance/legislation/
- In 2019-2020, COGS leadership has had a key role in revising/adopting important University policies/policy changes, including: RVSM Policy and Updates to the Student Rights & Responsibilities (SRR)
- In 2019-2020, COGS leadership has made an impact beyond the campus, including:
 - Reinstatement of COGS into active membership of the Student Activists for Graduate Education (SAGE), a national organization advocating for Graduate student education.
 - COGS represented at the SAGE Fall 2019 Summit at the University of Arizona
 - COGS has met with UM-Rackham Graduate Student Government to develop stronger avenues of communication in which to collaborate on state-level issues that affect all Graduate/Professional Students in Michigan.
- Provided \$5000 to MSU Student Food Bank to assist operations which serve all MSU students, including Graduate & Professional students. COGS also allocated an additional \$3,000.00 in March to help with increased student need during the pandemic.
- COGS stepped in to help Graduate/Professional students with unexpected costs associated with work/teach from home necessitated by the Covid-19 Crisis. They dispersed over \$10,000 in technology/work at home related expenses directly to students. COGS also allocated an additional \$10,000 to the Graduate School Student Emergency Fund.
- COGS helped to facilitate a graduate student presence among the various reopening task forces during the pandemic. COGS president additionally has



- coordinated regular meetings gathering all these representing graduate students to centralize the information coming from the various task forces.
- COGS Eboard and Full Council stayed active during the summer, holding meetings and robust discussions and make sure graduate student concerns are put forth to the groups and administrators charged with developing pandemic reopening policy.

CONFERENCE AWARDS

- Total dollars allocated FY19-20: **\$29,400**
- In September 2019, COGS received a \$4,000 donation from VP Graduate Research to use toward Conference Awards.
- Conference Award winners are granted **\$300 each**.
- In Fall 2019, MSU graduate and professional students were able to attend conferences in **27 cities and 11 countries** with the help of Conference Awards.
- In 2019-20, Conference Awards were awarded to **86 students** across **34+ departments/programs.**
- COGS allowed SS20 award winners flexibility to use their award funds toward unreimbursed travel cancellation costs if affected by the coronavirus travel ban.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AWARDS

- Total dollars allocated (By Graduate School) FY19-20:: \$18,000
- Professional Development Awards were distributed to 36 students across
 20+ departments at MSU for 2019-2020

GSO SINGLE-HOST EVENT FUNDING

- Total dollars allocated FY19/20: **\$22,000.00**
- Total dollars awarded FY18/19: **\$20,904.47**
- 18 Graduate Student Organizations were awarded over \$16,000.00 in funding during 19-20. Though SS20 saw many events cancelled, groups spent over half of these allocated funds, while some surplus, from this and conference awards, was reallocated by resolution to other cost centers, to help students with unexpected costs from the coronavirus (via the COGS Technology Assistance Awards and Graduate School Emergency fund, and MSU Food Bank).



COVID-19 TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE AWARDS

- Students were able to apply for up to \$50 in reimbursement funds to help cover unexpected costs associated with working/learning from home due to the stay at home order during the pandemic.
- COGS awarded & processed over 200 reimbursement requests between April & May 2020.
- To cover the reimbursement awards, COGS reallocated leftover funds (per resolution 20-SS-37) from the Conference Award cost center (approx. \$4.000) and reallocated the rest of needed funds from the GSO Single Host Event Cost Center. Spending from both areas stopped when the pandemic interrupted spring semester.

CHILDCARE ENDOWMENT

- Formally stated COGS commitment to this effort by passing a resolution to support.
- FS19 funded 5 eligible students with \$500 each for a total COGS **funds of \$678.00** and the rest of the **\$1822** covered by the endowment account.
- President Abel is seeking partners to help fundraise to be able to offer more funds for childcare in the future.

DISCIPLINARY LEADERSHIP AWARD

- 5 students were awarded **\$2,000.00 (ea.)** for this award which is funded by COGS and managed by The Graduate School. Winners announced SS20 and listed on The Graduate School website.
- Three COGS representatives (not Eboard) were chosen to serve on the application review/selection committee.
- President Abel secured future commitment for the program's continuance form Dean Jeitschko of The Graduate School. She further committed to work with Development in the Graduate School to secure new sources of revenue support for the program going forward.

- 75 students purchased \$2 tickets

- 30 Attendees (@capacity) for ea. 2 sessions at MSU Sailing Center
- Event was free for graduate & professional students
- Intended to provide some summer programming and introduce students to MSU Sailing Center offerings

COGS Potter Park Zoo Tour - 8/9/19

- 58 students purchased \$2 tickets
- Students gathered at Zoo for an educational experience with the docents and zookeepers and then were able to tour the zoo at their leisure.
- Intended to provide some summer programming and introduce students to a family friendly venue in nearby Lansing

- 884+ attendees
- **18 vendors** providing activities, food, resources for students.
- \$8,150.00Total donations received: \$ from departments
- **75 prizes** given away from **20** different donors



Fall 2019 Football Tailgates

- August 30 v Tulsa, September 28 v Indiana and Oct. 26 v Illinois
- 100 200+ students attended each
- Tailgates include free food, DJ and encourage mingling with graduate/professional student peers while celebrating Spartan pride!

Good Morning With COGS! - 8/28/19

- COGS President and Director of Event Planning were on hand at both the International Center and in Chittenden Hall with coffee/coffee coupons, donuts & treats and COGS info & swag. They were out to greet graduate & professional students from 9 to 11am on the first official day of the semester.
- Intended to show support for Graduate/Professional students and be on hand to help if advice or resources are needed.

Green Dot Social - 9/6/19

- COGS President, VPIA and Director of Event Planning were on hand at Green Dot Stables in Lansing to host the COGS Social. A drop-in social gathering to have students meet and mingle with their peers and celebrate the first full week of the semester.
- Event was free for graduate & professional students and food was provided. Over 60 students attended.

Trivia Night at Harrison Roadhouse - 9/24/19

- **27 students** enthusiastically attended Trivia Night event, which is intended to provide social outlet and peer networking opportunity for graduate & professional students.
- TeamTrivia productions facilitates the trivia. Students are encouraged to come with teammates or come ready to meet new friends and be placed on a team.
- Students enjoyed snacks, team-style trivia and prizes, and Harrison Roadhouse gift certificates for winning trivia teams.



Annual COGS Red Wings Hockey Game Bus Trip - 10/27/19

- Brought **95** Graduate & Professional students to enjoy a Detroit Red Wings game on 10/27. Included round trip charter bus, game ticket and food voucher. Trip cost was heavily subsidised by COGS.
- Social Event intends to bring graduate & professional students together for a fun, regional sporting event that they might not otherwise be able to afford or experience.

- COGS hosted a Bias Incident Listening Session for Grad/Professional Students on the evening of 10/24. This was in response to a number of Fall 2019 bias incidents on campus. It provided a forum for graduate/professional students to share feelings and dialogue with each other and with University administrative representatives. Counseling and Psychiatric Services was on hand to meet with any students feeling upset or unsafe.

WHARTON CENTER SHOW TICKETS

DISCOUNTED FITNESS PASSES

- Collaborated with Graduate Student Life & Wellness to provide additional funds toward allowing more graduate/prof. Students to get discounts on rec sports & fitness Group and Individual Fitness Passes.
- COGS Funds helped provide more passes PLUS a match from Rec Sports & Fitness for a total of **140** additional passes available to students FS19 and SS20.
 *NOTE: Students could contact Rec Sports in SS20 for refund on passes due to COVID pandemic.

LEGAL SERVICES TO GRAD STUDENTS

 COGS continues to fund free legal services through Student Legal Services for Graduate & Professional Students. annual reports for Student Legal Services are available at http://studentlegalservices.com/annual-report.html

SHORT-TERM LOANS

- COGS funds a \$500 (interest free for 60 days) loan program that the Office of Financial Aid administers. Applications for the \$500 loan are available in 252 Student Services, and take 2-3 business days to process.
- There is **\$8000** in a revolving account. COGS President is continuing her work from 2018-19 on an initiative with The Graduate School Development Officer to avail additional funds to be able to serve more students in need.
- COGS also sponsors a \$300 (interest free for 8 weeks) loan program that the ASMSU Office administers. (Loans are only available during the first 6 weeks of classes.)
