ORIENTATION

COGS Eboard Members and Representatives spoke and answered questions about COGS in person and virtually at department 16+ orientation events and resource fairs this fall. COGS also participated in the Graduate Resource Fair on August 24, 2024.

REPRESENTATION

During 24-25, 57 graduate student departments, and 3 student organizations, appointed representatives on COGS Full Council. These graduate student representatives participated in 8 monthly full council meetings, passed **43** pieces of <u>legislation</u> and served on committees across campus to ensure the graduate student perspective is considered at every level. A list of these University Academic Governance and COGS Committee appointments is attached to this report.

REFERENDUM - 2025

COGS is a tax-collecting governing group at MSU, meaning that the governing body assesses a fee to all graduate and professional students enrolled in classes at MSU. This tax is approved by a vote open to all graduate and professional students every three years. The COGS tax renewal was most recently authorized in <u>April of 2025</u>. The referendum passed, approving a continuance of the current tax: \$11 for the Fall Semester, \$11 for the Spring Semester, and \$5 for the Summer Semester. UNIVERSITY CONNECTIONS

COGS leadership has worked to recruit/nominate/place graduate and professional students, across disciplines, on hearing boards, judiciaries, standing and ad-hoc committees across the University. Graduate & Professional students served to represent the graduate-professional student community on Hearing boards, including AUSB, USAB, SFSB and UPGJ and UJG, and provided the graduate/professional student voice on over 25 committees across the University that affect a full range of the student experience, on such issues as research, curriculum, campus issues, safety, student wellness and mental health, insurance, transportation,



community relations, university policy, key administration hires, and more. In 2024-2025, COGS facilitated and approved graduate & professional student service to serve on over 90 COGS and University committee positions across campus.

- Rep. Sabrina Curley, CHE (23-24), and Rep. Nic Heilman, CMSE (23-24/Treas 24-25) developed a survey to assess the degree of safety practices as it applies to daily research among graduate students at MSU. - COGS appointed representation to provide the graduate student perspective on the University's Free Speech Hate Speech Committee
- COGS Eboard members convened with other stakeholders to provide input for advancing the growth and impact of the MSU Student Food Bank (MSUSFB).
- COGS members served on the MLK Jr. Commemorative Committee as well as Committees related to planning the Cesar Chavez and Dolores Huerta Commemorative Celebration and Juneteenth Celebration
- Noah Lubben, COGS VPIA and student in the College of Human Medicine, and Saviour Kitcher, Secretary, co-chaired and directed the 2025 Graduate Academic Conference held on February 22, 2025. The event was planned and staffed by multiple COGS members!
- COGS members participated in providing input in the University searches for a new Provost and VP of Student Affairs (VPSA)
- COGS facilitated nominations of graduate students to the 2025 2026
 President's Student Council
- Paige Baisley, PSMS representative, attended the MSU Student Health Symposium 2025 to ensure graduate-professional student concerns had a voice.



- COGS representatives served on the Student Wellness Activator Network (SWAN), playing a crucial role in promoting and enhancing the health and wellbeing of graduate & professional student peers.
- COGS helped to recruit graduate student members to serve on the Office of Research Regulatory Support Graduate Student Advisory Committee a new initiative from the Office of Research & Innovation.
- Paige Baisley, rep PSMS, served on the City of East Lansing University Student Commission
- Rachael Pyram, COGS DoEA, served on the workgroup for Students and Employees Affected by Pregnancy, Childbirth and Other Pregnancy Related Conditions Policy Review & Feedback
- Rachael Pyram, COGS DoEA, served on the Student Excellence Committee, which is part of MSU's DEI Strategic Plan and focuses on graduate & undergraduate students.
- Vincent Liu, COGS Representative for the Department of Criminal Justice, served on the Campus Survey Committee to formally review large-scale surveys before they're sent out to large portions of the campus.

ADVOCACY

In 2024-2025, COGS leadership has made an impact in the lives of graduate and professional students, including:

- Responding to increased need and food insecurity, COGS maintained their increased annual donation of \$8000 to MSU Student Food Bank to assist operations which serve all MSU students, including Graduate & Professional students.
- COGS Collaborated with the Graduate School to subsidize registration costs for the annual Write Winning Grants workshop for graduate students to attend
- COGS voted to cover the costs for graduate & professional students to attend a tax preparation webinar & workshop series: How to Complete Your Graduate Student Tax Return and Understand It Too
- Sponsored the InJoy Gala celebration for graduate students



- Sponsored grad/professional student attendance at the HEAL Sexual Health Conference.
- Sponsored 15th Annual Cesar Chavez and Dolores Huerta Commemorative Celebration
- Sponsored the 5th Annual Juneteenth Celebration
- Sponsored ComSciCon25-MI
- Successfully passed a Spring 2025 tax renewal referendum, which held the
 COGS tax to it's current semesterly rate of \$11 for fall and spring and \$5 summer
- Created a new service available to Graduate Student Organizations (GSO):
 COGS Lending Library. GSOs can apply to borrow COGS items such as yard games and collapsible easels for events. Located on the GSO Funding page
- Expanded the GSO Support Award to help GSOs with expenses toward enhancing their membership and transition processes and with a goal to provide stability of their programs.

CONFERENCE AWARDS

• For 2024-2025, over \$20,000 in conference awards were awarded to 68 students who traveled to 33 cities, 18 states and 6 countries to present their research.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AWARDS

- Total dollars allocated (By Graduate School) FY24-25: \$32,000.00 Thank you Graduate School!!
- Awards of up to \$500 each were dispersed to 61 students who attended workshops and other professional development opportunities (both virtual and in-person)

GSO SINGLE-HOST EVENT FUNDING

- COGS is excited to support diverse and exciting programming provided by Graduate Student Organizations across campus.
- In FY 24-25, over \$20,000.00 was allocated to 25 student organizations hosting events for graduate & professional students.



- COGS additionally supports GSOs with a fund to help programs/events that promote transition and long term stability of the org with a separate COGS GSO Support Award. The program was updated this past year.
- COGS started the new <u>COGS Lending Library</u> to offer large yard games and some other equipment for graduate student orgs to borrow for their events.

CHILDCARE ENDOWMENT

 COGS reaffirmed support in the 2024-25 budget for \$4000 to be provided over and above dollars earmarked from the endowment funds should more students apply for this award than funding is available. The COGS Childcare funding comes from investment interest dollars generated from a fund started by COGS over a decade ago. Graduate and Professional students that are not able to complete the <u>MSU Childcare Grant</u> application for lack of SS documentation or other non-financial based reasons, can opt in to be considered for this award. The Office of Financial Aid manages this process and both COGS and The Graduate School collaborate to provide additional funds when the need arises.

DISCIPLINARY & DEI LEADERSHIP AWARDS

- 9 students are awarded \$1,000.00 (ea.) for this award which is funded by COGS and managed by The Graduate School.
- Three COGS representatives (from the Full Council) were chosen to serve on the application review/selection committee for both awards, along with faculty and staff from The Graduate School.

COGS WORKSHOPS



- **Graduate Resource Series:** A virtual workshop series presented by the Graduate Welfare Committee, connects graduate & professional students with vital campus resources through informal, expert discussions, providing insights, Q&A opportunities, and practical guidance for student success and well-being. Sessions took place on Tuesdays, during February and March. Recordings of the sessions can be viewed **HERE**
- Virtual WORKSHOP: Quarterly Estimated Tax for Fellowship Recipients: COGS has partnered with Dr. Emily Roberts and Personal Finance for PhDs to offer this workshop for students on fellowships to learn how to manage quarterly taxes.
- Complete Your Grad Student Tax Return (and Understand It, Too!): This workshop breaks down how to calculate your taxable income from your salary, stipend, fellowship, grant, and/or scholarships; minimize your tax liability using education tax benefits; and report your income, qualified education expenses, and estimated tax paid on your tax return. Presented by Dr. Emily Roberts, personal finance educator specializing in early-career PhDs, workshop was appropriate for US citizens, permanent residents, and residents for tax purposes (International students), and comprised pre-recorded videos, worksheets, and live Q&A calls.

2024-2025 COGS SOCIAL EVENTS

COGS social events are often coordinated or proposed by the Director of Event Planning & COGS President. COGS leadership worked hard to incorporate many types of events to engage graduate and professional students and provide meaningful opportunities for connection and fun.

SUMMER EVENTS: 2024

This past summer, COGS teamed up with friends from the Graduate School, including <u>GROW</u> and <u>GREAT</u> to host several opportunities for informal gatherings of graduate students who stayed on campus during the quiet summer months. Activities included: Coffee & Connection on the Patio, outdoor Yoga, lunchtime group walk, Summertime Grad Paddle event at MSU Sailing Center, picnic meet up at the July summer Carillon Series at Beaumont Tower, and our summer fun Block Party! We found this to be a great time to meet new Spartan grad students who came to



campus early! We plan to continue this partnership on summer programming for Summer 2025+.

SHORT-TERM LOANS

- COGS funds a \$500 (interest free for 60 days) loan program that the Office of Financial Aid administers. Applications for the \$500 loan are available in 252 Student Services, and take 2-3 business days to process.
- COGS was also able to access a \$300 (interest free for 8 weeks) loan program that the ASMSU Office administers thank you ASMSU! (Those loans are only available during the first 6 weeks of classes.)
